Ignoring distractions

It may surprise you to know that on average 120% of a business NET profit is generated by the top 20% of customers...and 20% is lost on all the rest; that is, the 'bottom' 80% of customers.

This outcome often results from attempting to be everything-to-everyone, a big mistake because it spreads resources too thin; it ignores the needs of the best customers; and it bogs the team down with activity & busyness, without getting the best results.

My counsel for business owners:

Define your mission in order to inject clarity & direction into every aspect of the operation.

Your vision is WHERE you're leading the team; the mission provides the WHO, the WHAT and the HOW for the team to pursue that vision.

So, get together and work on three mission questions...

- 1: WHO is your preferred customer? Think here of your top 20% group
- 2: WHAT specific pain, problem or frustration will you solve for them?
- 3: HOW will your business ensure customers get a 5-star outcome?

The two main beneficiaries of a clearly defined mission:

First, your staff...because they will know exactly WHO to serve; exactly WHAT to sell; and exactly HOW to engage with and serve customers, thus minimizing distractions!

Second, your customers because your team is now very focused on solving their problem.

Compare these two missions:

Company A: "The air conditioning specialists"

Company B: "We manufacture evaporative air conditioners for the domestic market, selling direct to the public so families can stay cool in summer"

As a potential customer, which company would get your attention?
