**The bottom line: Chasing fantasies will surely end in losses...and for some, poverty!**

"Stick to your knitting" the experts say; that's good advice, to which I would add...

*...Work out the best (i.e., preferred) niche to target within your marketplace and current customer database; then aim to be the most sought-after, premium supplier serving that NICHE with unique, unmatched product 'packages' that solve those peoples' main problem*

Don't be distracted by unrelated business or investment 'opportunities' because most will turn out to be fantasies...especially if borrowed money is involved!

Rather, fix your under-performing business; then get into a financial position where you can thoroughly investigate other opportunities in your niche or outside if you're led that way.
